# **Cindy Decker**

How long you have been an artist? I am not sure I'm an artist now, but I've always been a creative type. I wrote my first play at 7 years old. It was about a smoking, drinking bunny. My parents did \*not\* consider therapy. Through the years, I pursued a number of creative activities including needlework, but I made my living with words. I worked for years in publications, most recently as Home, Garden, Travel and Books editor at The Columbus Dispatch.

How you got into watercolors? Pursuit of watercolors was somewhat accidental. My good friend (and fellow COWS member) Glenda Childress asked whether I wanted to join her at a 6-day watercolor class back in 2018. I thought, why not? I had not painted at all before then, at least not since elementary school. The instructor was terrible. The classroom was full of mold and mildew, and all my paintings were dreadful. But I like a challenge so I kept with it.

What is your favorite subject matter to paint? I love flowers and bees. Because I've traveled a lot, I have many images to draw inspiration from.



# Kathleen Grannan (I go by Kathy)

I have a Facebook Page but it's not up to date. I would love to talk with others about websites. I started painting intermittently about 30 years ago, taking lessons up at Lakeside Chautauqua each summer from a variety of teachers, several of whom were COWS members.

My favorite subject matter is plein air subjects at Lakeside, but recently have been braver about trying more diverse subjects and abstract art.

I have been an artist since 2009. I was able to start taking classes regularly from Charlie Rowland at the Westerville Community Center until 2019. I got into watercolor with a Klutz book on Watercolor and encouragement from another artist! I was able to take my first class at Lakeside in 2001 and knew that watercolor was the media for me. Barns, especially old and run down barns are my favorite subject to paint.

#### Kim McMullen

I'm Kim McMullen. I drew throughout childhood and loved high school art class. I was serious enough to contemplate a double-major in English and studio art in college, but I kept getting closed out of required classes. Fast forward five decades. Contemplating retirement after 40+ years of teaching literature and writing (and buying the occasional sketch pad which I'd half fill and then lose), I signed up for a watercolor class. But once again the fates

intervened when COVID shut it down after only 4 sessions. But by then, I was besotted with the medium and became an autodidact painter over the lockdown. In January 2022, I began taking classes from COWS' own John Cameron (and recently Kevin Buckland) and my growth curve steepened exponentially. Because we live in rural Knox County and love to canoe and garden, my favorite subjects include landscapes, farmscapes, and various flora and fauna. We have also lived for four years in southwest England and I have a trove of memories and photos to call upon-- moorland, seascapes, ancient villages.
