Dear Artists,

We are very excited to welcome **Christopher Leeper** as our guest presenter for the April 14<sup>th</sup> COWS meeting! Please put this date on your calendar. You won't want to miss Christopher's presentation!

Christopher is a full-time artist from Canfield, Ohio. He is the author of "Realism in Watermedia", North Light. He has illustrated four children's books for the Smithsonian and the African Wildlife Foundation. His work has been featured in several books and publications, including "The Artist's Magazine, "American Artist", "Plein Air Magazine", and "Ohio Magazine". Christopher is a member of the adjunct faculty in the Department of Art at Youngstown State University. He served as President of the Ohio Watercolor Society (2008-2012). Christopher graduated from Youngstown State University in 1988 with a BFA degree in graphic design.

Our **Spring Show** will be held at the Faculty Club at The Ohio State University this year from April 30<sup>th</sup> – July 7<sup>th</sup>. **You will soon receive an email with the electronic invitation and press release for the Spring Show. Lisa Morton, from The Faculty Club,** has asked us to feel free to forward this invitation and press release to our friends and family to let them know about the upcoming COWS Spring Show.

Also, please note these two changes in the attached "Information and Entry Form" for the Spring Show that is attached to the Newsletter:

- 1) The "Artist's Reception" has been changed from Sunday, May 5th to Friday, May 3<sup>rd</sup> from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. at the Faculty Club. Suzanne Accetta and Jeff Stahler will give us updated information on the show at our meeting on April 14th.
- 2) The framed size restrictions of entries has been changed. The width of the FRAME must be between 14" and 26" (instead of the original 24") and the height of the FRAME must be between 14" and 26" (instead of the original 24").

We realized when we chose 24" as maximum frame dimension we were thinking 18" x 24" is a standard size, but we didn't take into account the frame width. So, we are asking you to keep the width of the frame 1" or under. That adds 2" in either direction.

#### Ned T. Moore

Ned T. Moore passed away on March 21, 2019 at his home in Columbus. Ned was a founding member and past president of the Central Ohio Watercolor Society. His true passion has always been drawing, sketching, and watercolor painting and is reflected in the hundreds of works of art he created over his lifetime. He exhibited widely and won numerous awards in competitive shows and public service exhibitions. He also served as a juror and critiqued shows throughout the midwest.

Ned began his career in advertising. The last 19 years of his career, Ed taught at the OSU School of Architecture and was an Associate Professor at the Columbus College of Art and Design.
