## **Castle Basics**

The Castle keeps reasonable amounts of the following consumable materials on hand throughout the year; they will not be separately included in the cost of a class. However, even if they are listed here, please include the materials under the Castle Materials section that the Castle should supply, so that we can be sure to have enough. Other materials may be available as well: check to be sure.

*Ceramics:* Low fire glazes in 8 basic colors, wax resist, brushes, buckets, rolling pins, respirator masks, sandpaper, recycled clay, basic throwing and handbuilding tools and stamps. New clay (various bodies available, including stoneware, terra cotta, and porcelain) as well as high fire glazes come under Special Materials, even though they are on hand.

*Jewelry/ Stained Glass:* Acetylene, oxygen, propane, flux, solder, safety glasses. Stained glass and cane come under Special Materials, even though they are on hand.

*Office Basics:* scotch tape, pencils/ pens, sharpie markers, masking tape, stapler with staples, rubber bands, adult & child scissors, tacks, binder clips, copy paper.

#### Visual Arts:

*Paint:* Watercolor paint in pans (school grade), Acrylic paint (school grade: black, white, red, yellow, blue), Tempura paint (black, white, red, yellow, blue).

*Brushes*: Scholastic-grade watercolor brush (flat #10, round #8, & misc. others), Scholastic-grade white bristle acrylic brush (flat #12, round #8, & misc. others), 2" paintbrushes

*Drawing*: Graphite pencils (6B, 4B, 2B, HB, 2H), Black ink drawing pens (NOT sumi pens), Blending sticks-small, Charcoal pencils (2B and white), Erasers (pink pearl, rubber, white plastic), Colored Pencils, Crayons, Markers (thick & thin), Handheld sharpeners

*Paper*: Construction paper (basic 8 colors), Newsprint, White drawing paper, Large format easel paper, Tagboard, White butcher paper, Tissue paper (basic 8 colors), Scrap/Collage paper (including wallpaper samples and magazines)

Adhesives: Elmer's School Glue, Hot glue Guns with glue sticks (teacher use only unless otherwise arranged)

## Other:

Exacto knife #11 w/ blades (teacher use only)

Fabric, ribbon, & yarn/string -- variety of weights, patterns, and textures

Plastic gloves and tablecloths

Embellishment items such as buttons, feathers, craft sticks, gems, glitter, pasta, beans, pipe cleaners, wood scraps, and misc. items
